We, the members of Saint Hyacinth Parish, while preserving and promoting our Polish heritage, welcome and serve all community members through prayer, example and good works. We seek to be a guiding light to all God's people through our spiritual and social activities.



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY - The Feast of the Divine Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday falls on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is dedicated to the devotion to the Divine Mercy promoted by Saint Faustina (Faustyna Kowalska). Saint Faustina included the message Jesus gave her in her diary: "On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The 33rd revelation enumerates two conditions to obtain this mercy: The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. But Jesus desired that the greatest possible number of faithful benefit from this grace. Consequently He did not require that Communion as well as Confession be made on that same Sunday, since in the case of a large crowd it would be impossible, for example, in parishes with only one priest. It is permitted then to infer that He allows confession to be made several days before the Feast of Mercy; He insists, however, that one receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast itself. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flows are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity."

The devotion was celebrated unofficially in many places for some years. On April 30, 2000 (Divine Mercy Sunday of that year), Pope John Paul II canonized Saint Faustina and designated the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday in the General Roman Calendar. Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to Confession and then receive Him in Holy Communion on this day. You are encouraged to take advantage of this incredible promise. The Image of The Divine Mercy, and the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist will be on display and venerated in our church today. Please take the time to visit with this Image of The Divine Mercy and venerate Jesus.

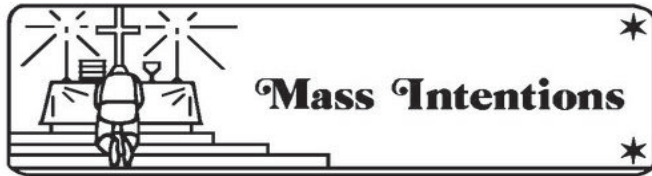

The week began with celebration of Palm Sunday and the touching procession around the inside of the church. All parishioners were welcomed to join the procession to partake in symbolic remembrance of Christ's entry into Jerusalem. The Breakfast with the Easter Bunny was also held on Palm Sunday with some 200 guests during the day. The guests enjoyed a delicious breakfast, time with friends and family, played a few games and of course had the chance to say hello and take a picture with the Easter Bunny.

On Holy Thursday, Saint Hyacinth hosted the first stop of the Poletown Church Pilgrimage sponsored by the American Polish Assistance Association (APAA). The pilgrims attended the 6:00 PM Mass and then enjoyed a full dinner before embarking on the remainder of the pilgrimage.

Good Friday services included the Gorzkie Zale, Stations of the Cross and veneration of the cross. At the end of the services, the Hosts were transferred from the altar to the tabernacle by the tomb of Jesus.
