We, the members of Saint Hyacinth Parish, while preserving and promoting our Polish heritage, welcome and serve all community members through prayer, example and good works. We seek to be a guiding light to all God's people through our spiritual and social activities.

Solemnity of The Body and Blood of Christ - If we obey Christ, everything will be OK. He is in control. He doesn't make mistakes. From our narrow, ignorant, and earthly perspective, sometimes his teachings (and those of his Church) look strange, or overly difficult. But that's just because of our limited perspective. We are only children. We can't understand everything yet. But Christ's teachings are God's teachings, and we are called to obey them. He also wants us to understand them, which is one of the reasons he gives us a Church, to explain his teachings to us. But the fact remains that we are mere finite creatures, and our job is to obey our Creator, even when we don't fully understand the whys and the hows.

This was one of the lessons Jesus taught his Apostles when he preformed the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves. Imagine the Apostles' reaction when Jesus commanded them to feed those 5,000 people with a few loaves and fishes. We can just picture them looking at him, shocked, pointing out that they don't really have enough food for that many people. But Jesus insists. He tells them to arrange the crowds and give him their loaves. And they do it. They don't understand it, but they do it. Because Jesus is the one asking it. Then Jesus works the miracle, and the Apostles' confused frustration turns into overflowing gratitude and joy. Christ's grace far exceeded anything they could have done by depending on their human qualities alone. And the same goes for us.

More than our brilliant minds, rich personalities, and fabulous organizational skills, God needs us to give him our trust, faith, and obedience, just because he is God, just as the Apostles did. With those, he will do wonders.

God is active in each of our lives. He is asking something from each one of us, something difficult. He may be asking us to forgive someone who doesn't deserve to be forgiven. He may be asking us to take a leap of faith and finally start obeying his teaching on artificial birth control. He may be asking us to give up a sinful habit or to confess a sin that has been poisoning our lives. He may be asking some of those among us to give their lives completely to him, following a vocation to the priesthood or the consecrated life. Each one of us knows what God is asking of us. And each one of us is probably feeling a little bit afraid to say yes. Jesus wants to overcome that fear. And he can, through the Eucharist.

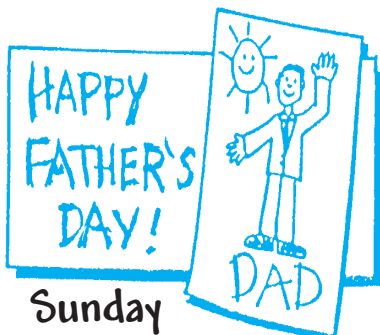

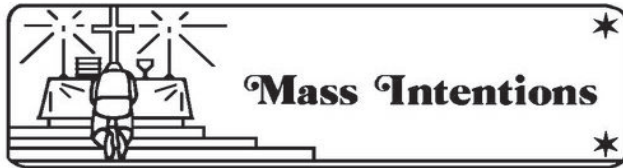

Corpus Christi Sunday - "While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take it; this is my body.' Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.'" The Holy Eucharist is the ongoing redemption of the world through Christ's real presence among and within us. This helps us understand why the Church is so respectful of the Blessed Sacrament.

Today we celebrate the beautiful feast of Corpus Christi. Today, every Catholic throughout the world is turning their attention to this divine gift by which Jesus Christ, under the appearances of bread and wine, continues to dwell among us and to nourish our souls through the most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist.

There are two miracles involved in this sacrament, two miracles that occur at every Mass. During the words of consecration, the humble, normal substances of bread and wine are changed into Christ's living body and blood. The substance of the bread is changed into his body, and the substance of the wine is changed into his blood; this process is called "transubstantiation." They are truly changed; Christ becomes truly present in them. This is the first miracle.

The second miracle is that although the substance of the bread and wine has changed, their appearance remains the same. After the sacred words of consecration, they still look like bread and wine, but under those appearances, Jesus is truly present. This is why we treat the Eucharist with such reverence: it is not just a symbol; it is a sacrament, a mystery of Christ's real presence. These two miracles are performed at every Mass, through the ministry of the priest, by the power of the Holy Spirit. And right after the words of consecration, we all express our wonder, awe, and belief in these two miracles when we give our response to the priest's invitation: "Let us proclaim the mystery of faith."
