SAINT HYACINTH PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

We, the members of Saint Hyacinth Parish, while preserving and promoting our Polish heritage, welcome and serve all community members through prayer, example and good works. We seek to be a guiding light to all God's people through our spiritual and social activities.

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time - Jesus allows this sinful woman to come close to him, to have direct contact with him. And then he administers his forgiveness through real words spoken with a real, audible voice. This was incomprehensible to Simon the Pharisee. First of all, only God had the authority to forgive sins (and Simon didn't think Jesus was God). But even more than that, the whole encounter was too mundane, too down-to-earth. Simon was convinced that God was too spiritual for that kind of thing. Not even a prophet would let such a sinful woman come that close, would lower himself to that level. And yet, Jesus is glad that she has come. Jesus knew that it was hard for the woman to admit her weakness and neediness in front of other people. But it was the best thing for her to do. Only in that context was she able to express physically, humanly, through her tears and the ointment, her sorrow for her sins, her trust and confidence in his mercy. And only in that context was Jesus able to speak audibly and unmistakably his words of love and forgiveness.

After this encounter, she would never have to doubt God's forgiveness. She could always point back to that specific moment in her life as her new beginning. If she had been an angel, she wouldn't have wanted to show her love and repentance with tears and anointing. If she had been an angel, it would have been appropriate for God to speak directly to her heart without any human mediation. But she wasn't an angel. And neither are we. We have the same need she had. And God knows it. That's why he has given us the sacrament of confession.

"Thus, the gift of the Sacrament of Penance not only consists in the reception of forgiveness, but also and above all in being aware of our need for forgiveness. With this Sacrament we are purified, we are inwardly transformed and subsequently able to understand others even better and to forgive them.

"For the human being, the recognition of sin is elementary -- he is ill if he no longer perceives it --, and the liberating experience of being granted forgiveness is equally important for him. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the crucial place where both these things take place."

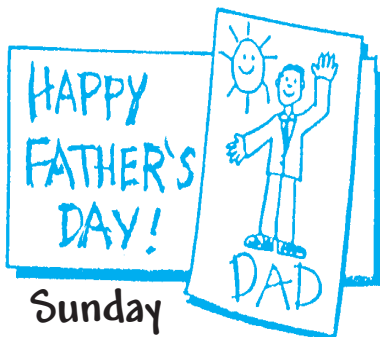

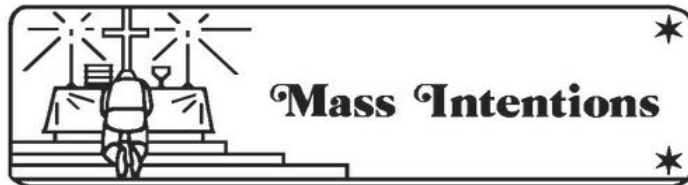

Father Jerzy Popieluszko - More than 100,000 people gathered Sunday in Warsaw for the beatification of Father Jerzy Popieluszko, an anti-communist Polish priest killed by Poland's communist secret in 1984. The event highlights the powerful link between Polish patriotism and the Catholic Church.

As the Vatican's Archbishop Angelo Amato led a mass in Latin, more than 100,000 people sat, stood or kneeled in a square in central Warsaw to witness the beatification of one of Poland's most beloved figures.

Father Jerzy Popieluszko was a Catholic priest who spoke out against the communist regime in the 1980s holding mass for striking workers and supporting the families of political prisoners. Radio Free Europe broadcast his sermons across Poland, and for many Poles, he became a symbol of resistance - a symbol that became even more powerful when he was kidnapped, beaten and killed by the Polish secret police in 1984. Since then, Father Popieluszko has been something of a popular saintly figure. Hundreds of thousands gathered for his funeral in 1984 and an estimated 18 million people have visited his tomb. A movie about his life was one of Poland's highest-grossing films last year.

In Poland, associating political resistance with the Catholic Church is not unusual. The Church is a much stronger presence here than in neighboring countries, and it has often come into conflict with the authorities. Many Poles associate the Church with resistance against oppression. There are those who feel it was the Polish Pope, John Paul II, who eventually rid the country of communism. Many people came to see the Church as the true heart of the Polish nation.

After the mass, a procession carried Father Popieluszko's remains - now called relics - to a church in southern Warsaw. They were interred beside a symbolic tomb of Pope John Paul II.
