SAINT HYACINTH PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

We, the members of Saint Hyacinth Parish, while preserving and promoting our Polish heritage, welcome and serve all community members through prayer, example and good works. We seek to be a guiding light to all God's people through our spiritual and social activities.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Jesus sends his 72 disciples out to preach the Gospel, and they come back rejoicing at the success of their mission. And then Jesus says something rather strange. He tells them, "I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven." Biblical commentators differ on their interpretation of this sentence. Some read it as if Jesus were simply affirming the reports from the disciples. It would be like Jesus saying, "Yes, while you were preaching and healing, I was here and I saw Satan's influence rolling back wherever you spread the Good News." Others read the saying as an introduction to the rest of his speech, as a warning against unhealthy pride, the cause of Satan's original fall from grace. In this case, the phrase would mean, "Well, it's good that you have experienced the power of my salvation, but be careful. If you forget that this power comes not from yourselves but from on high, you may fall into the tragic trap that the devil fell into, thinking that you are on par with God."

In either case, the lesson remains the same. Those who trust in God and obey his call in their lives, as did the seventy-two, will experience God's power acting in and through their lives, which is exactly what Christ wants. That experience will then open the door to the stable kind of happiness that only God can give, because it teaches us to depend on God, who is all-powerful, and not on ourselves, who are far from being all-powerful. A Christian's happiness doesn't arise from how great we are or how great our achievements have been. It comes from knowing that we matter to God, that God is our Father, Savior and Friend. It comes, as Jesus tells us, from having our "names written in heaven." One of the easiest and most fruitful ways to apply this lesson in our lives is through being honest in our prayer. Unfortunately, we sometimes fall into routine in our prayer life. We recite familiar prayers, memorized prayers, without even thinking about them. God is always pleased whenever we take time to pray, and he listens to us even when we fall into routine. And yet, he longs for a closer relationship with us. He wants to be as close to us as a mother is to her child - as he mentions in the First Reading "...as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you."

So we should never be afraid to open our hearts completely to God in prayer. Life is full of victories and defeats, celebrations and frustrations, sunny days and rainouts. We should bring all of this to God in prayer. We should take time every day to speak to God from our hearts, just as Jesus taught us with his example in the Garden of Gethsemane, when he felt anguish and fear as he prayed, and didn't hide it. This week, let's take a few minutes each day to share with the Lord our deepest longings, satisfactions, hopes, and fears. No masks. No routine. No hesitations. His love has room for it all. Let's start today, in this Mass. There are moments of silence in Mass, especially after Holy Communion. Let's open our hearts to him then, with complete confidence. If we do, God will have more room to work in our lives, and he will teach us how to rejoice as only citizens of heaven can.

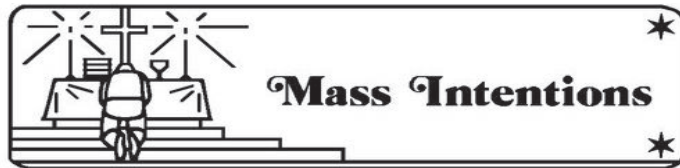

Father Solanus Casey Guild 50th Anniversary

It was 50 years ago that a couple of lay people launched the group that continues to promote awareness of the life and teachings of Venerable Solanus Casey, the famous Capuchin friar.



Father Solanus Casey was a Capuchin friar to whose prayers during his life and his intercession after his death many have attributed miraculous cures. His concern for the hungry during the Great Depression provided the inspiration for the Capuchin Soup Kitchen. In 1966, the Father Solanus Guild and the Capuchin Province of Saint Joseph initiated the Cause of Solanus Casey for sainthood. In 1995, Pope John Paul II declared Solanus Casey worthy of veneration, earning him the title "Venerable." Nearly three years after the July 31, 1957, death of Father Solanus, a couple that had known him during his years here in Detroit gathered 26 people together to form the Father Solanus Guild in May 1960.

Dan and Clara Ryan have since passed away, but the effort they started not only spurred the Capuchin Province of St. Joseph to begin the official cause for sainthood of its most famous member, but today has close to 100,000 members in the United States and 37 other countries.

Many of those members living in the metro area are expected to attend one of the four weekend Masses, July 24-25 in the chapel of Saint Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit, as the Father Solanus Guild begins to celebrate its 50th anniversary.

It was at the monastery, on Mount Elliott Avenue near Kercheval, that Father Solanus entered the Capuchins and later spent much of his ministry.

Saturday, July 24 Father John Celichowski, OFM Cap., the Capuchins' provincial minister will celebrate the 4:00 PM Mass and will be homilist at all four Masses.

Sunday, July 25 Father Larry Webber, OFM Cap., director of the Solanus Casey Center, which is adjacent to the monastery, will celebrate the 9:00 AM Mass; Msgr. Robert Sarno of the Vatican's Congregation for Causes of Saints will preside the 11:00 AM Mass; and Cardinal Adam Maida will preside the 1:30 PM Mass.

For both the 11:00 AM. and 1:30 PM. Masses, music will be provided by the Solanus Casey Choir, directed by Dennis Choiniere. Following the Saturday Mass, many of those present will head out to The Ark at St. Ambrose Parish in Grosse Pointe Park for the guild's 50th anniversary dinner. Tickets are \$50; to buy tickets call (313) 579-2100.

All those who are devoted to Father Solanus are being asked by the guild to participate in a special novena in memory of his death. The novena will start July 23 and end on July 31, the actual day of his death.
