## *SAINT HYACINTH PARISH MISSION STATEMENT*

*We, the members of Saint Hyacinth Parish, while preserving and promoting our Polish heritage, welcome and serve all community members through prayer, example and good works. We seek to be a guiding light to all God's people through our spiritual and social activities.*

**Feast of Christ the King** - The Feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations. Today's Mass establishes the titles for Christ's royalty over men: 1. Christ is God, the Creator of the universe and hence wields a supreme power over all things; "All things were created by Him"; 2. Christ is our Redeemer, He purchased us by His precious Blood, and made us His property and possession; 3. Christ is Head of the Church, "holding in all things the primacy"; 4. God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as his special possession and dominion.

Today's Mass also describes the qualities of Christ's kingdom. This kingdom is: 1) supreme, extending not only to all peoples but also to their princes and kings; 2) universal, extending to all nations and to all places; 3) eternal, for "The Lord shall sit a King forever"; 4) spiritual, Christ's "kingdom is not of this world".

Today on this Feast of Christ the King, we are presented with two distinct choices. The two men hanging on crosses on either side of Jesus represent, in their comments, the choice between faith in God and the rejection of faith. The first only wants to be saved from his fate. The second man expresses his faith that Jesus Christ is who he says he is, and asks only to be remembered. The second man is promised the great reward of eternally being with Christ because of his faith. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that Christ died as part of God's offering of salvation for us all, as was foretold in the scriptures. In the history of humankind, slavery has existed; only kings and rulers have had the authority to end slavery. Christ the King, in his Passion, gave his life for each and every soul on earth, freeing us from the slavery of sin.

Honor Flight Michigan's mission is to provide an all expenses paid trip for Michigan's WWII Veterans to Washington, DC to visit the memorial that has been dedicated to honor their service and their sacrifices for our country. It is their intention to honor as many of these selfless "ordinary people who saved the world" as they can by providing them this once in a lifetime opportunity to visit their memorial.

Honor Flight Michigan is a unique organization. It is run entirely by volunteers with no administrative overhead, no paid employees or government support and is funded entirely by caring, statewide community donations. Through this support they were able to send 414 Michigan veterans in 2007 on their "trip of a lifetime".
